


The instructions shown here are tailored for an Origami Frame using 12"x12" paper. You can use any size paper as long as it is square. Adjust the measurements to the size paper you choose.


Using the Scor-it or a paper trimmer with a scoring blade, score paper as shown in the diagram.


Crease the paper at all of the scored lines to make it easier to create the outer structure of the frame.


- Crease the scores closest to the edges of the paper. See green lines.
- Crease the shallow corners. See red lines.
- Crease the deeper corners.
 See purple lines.

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Flatten out the paper.

Start at the top, left-hand side. Fold in corner and then fold in the whole side. See Photos 1 and 2.


Now the tricky part, you'll have to manipulate the corners. Repeat the process from Photo 2 with the side of the paper closest to you. See Photo 3.

Repeat the process with the remaining sides/corners until you've done all sides. See Photo 4.

Origami Frame (Scor-It and Bind-it-All Project)

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There are now four points in the center of the frame. Fold each one of these up to meet the edge of the frame. See photo5.

Once all of the center sections are folded out, your frame is complete. See Photo 6.

Use the frame as-is or weight under a heavy book to flatten before binding.
